And, of course, as a cherry on top, Dubrovnik or “The Pearl of the Adriatic” with its stunning architecture and picturesque landscapes. The tour includes transportation, a professional guide, hotel accommodation, and entrance fees, so choose your dates and join us for a “once-in-a-lifetime” experience.

## Day 1. Welcome to Serbia

Arrive at Belgrade's "Nikola Tesla" Airport, where your guide will meet you in the arrivals hall. They will assist with currency exchange, provide essential city information, and help with check-in. You'll also be briefed on key sights and events. If you arrive earlier, you can book extra nights at the hotel. After checking in, take time to explore Belgrade independently or follow your guide's suggestions for dinner. Overnight: Belgrade

## Day 2. Explore Belgrade

After breakfast, embark on a sightseeing tour of Belgrade. Visit Belgrade Fortress, including the Victor Monument, Monument of Gratitude to France, and other notable landmarks such as the Zindan Gate and the Clock Tower. Continue with a panoramic ride through New Belgrade, showcasing modern architecture like the Genex Tower, Palace of Federation, and Sava Center.

Explore Zemun's charming quarters and fish restaurants along the Danube. Stroll its cobblestone streets and enjoy the blend of Mediterranean and Middle European cultures.

Afterward, drive through Dedinje's luxurious residential area and visit Saint Sava Temple, one of the world's largest Orthodox churches. Spend the afternoon leisurely—visit Nikola Tesla's Museum, wander around central streets, or relax. Explore the Bohemian Quarter of Skadarlija in the evening for traditional Serbian cuisine and vibrant nightlife.

## Day 3. Transfer to Zagreb & Zagreb walking tour

After breakfast, travel to Croatia's capital, Zagreb. This scenic journey takes approximately 4 hours, depending on border crossings.

Upon arrival, check-in at your hotel and refresh before starting a walking tour. Begin in Upper Town's Kaptol Square, featuring Zagreb Cathedral with its iconic spires. Walk to St. Mark's Church, known for its colorful roof, and see the 17th-century Jesuit Church of St. Catherine. Visit the Parliament building and enjoy free time to explore Ban Jelacic Square, Ilica Street's vibrant shops, and the Old Town's winding streets.

## Day 4. From Plitvice Lakes to Dalmatian Coast

After breakfast, leave Zagreb and head to Plitvice Lakes National Park, a **UNESCO** World Heritage site. This natural wonder features 16 interconnected lakes and breathtaking waterfalls surrounded by lush forests. Enjoy a 3-hour guided tour through this pristine environment. Stop for lunch, then continue the journey to Split, a **UNESCO**-protected seaside town. After a two-hour drive, arrive in Split and check in at your accommodation.



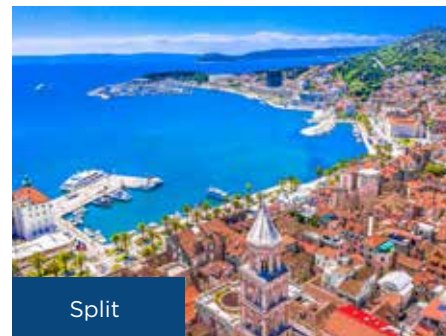

## Day 5. Split - Diocletian's Palace & Game of Thrones

After breakfast, embark on a walking tour of Split's Old Town, centered around the impressive Diocletian's Palace, a remarkable Roman architectural masterpiece.



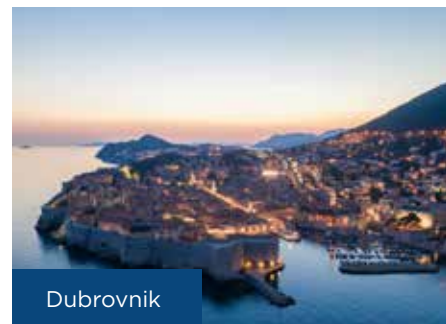

Explore its ancient corridors, visit the Cathedral of St. Domnius, and admire the Temple of Jupiter, guarded by a black sphinx. You'll also see key filming locations for the popular Game of Thrones series. Spend the afternoon at your leisure. Options include exploring Marjan Hill for panoramic views, visiting local museums, taking a catamaran to Hvar Island, or relaxing on Split's picturesque beaches.

## Day 6. Dubrovnik, The Pearl of the Adriatic

After breakfast, depart Split and drive along the scenic Dalmatian coast, arriving in Dubrovnik after approximately three hours. Check-in at your hotel, then join the "Old Dubrovnik on foot" tour to explore this **UNESCO** World Heritage Site.

Highlights include Rector's Palace, Sponza Palace, and the City Bell Tower. Stroll along the ancient city walls for stunning views of the Adriatic Sea, or visit the Maritime Museum in St. John's Castle. Spend the rest of the day at leisure, exploring Lokrum Island or taking the Dubrovnik cable car for panoramic views.

## Day 7. Full-day Montenegro experience

After breakfast, travel to Montenegro and discover the breathtaking Bay of Kotor, the longest fjord in Southern Europe.

Visit the charming coastal town of Perast, known for its baroque palaces, and take a boat ride to “Our Lady of the Rocks” Church, situated on a man-made islet. Continue to Kotor, a UNESCO-listed medieval town with narrow streets, fortified walls, and landmarks such as St. Tryphon’s Cathedral and the Maritime Museum. Enjoy a lunch break and explore the town’s unique atmosphere. Later, cross into Bosnia and Herzegovina, ending the day in Trebinje, a quaint town blending Mediterranean, Central European, and Ottoman influences.

## Day 8. Herzegovina story: Mostar & Blagaj Tekke

Start the day with a visit to Blagaj, a historic site featuring a 16th-century monastery set against the cliffs along the emerald-green Buna River.



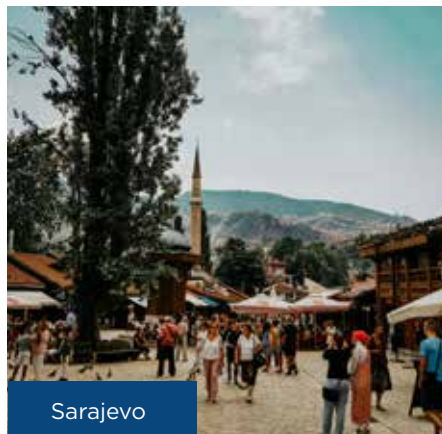

Next, travel to Mostar, renowned for its UNESCO-protected Old Bridge, cobblestone streets, and Ottoman-era architecture. Walk through the Old Town, visit Koski Mehmed Pasha Mosque, and enjoy free time for lunch by the Neretva River. Admire the beautiful views of the bridge and surrounding landscape. In the late afternoon, travel to Sarajevo, the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina. After check-in, enjoy the evening exploring Sarajevo’s lively restaurants and cultural sites.

## Day 9. Explore Sarajevo

Begin your day with a tour of Sarajevo’s Old Town.

Visit the Turkish Bazaar (Baščaršija), Gazi Husrev-bey Mosque, and Sebilj Fountain, each reflecting the city’s rich Ottoman heritage. Discover landmarks like the Gavrilo Princip Museum and the poignant Sarajevo Roses, commemorating those lost during the siege of Sarajevo. Stroll along the Miljacka River, visit the City Hall, and see the remnants of the 1984 Winter Olympics venues. After lunch, return to Belgrade, which is a five-hour drive with a few rest stops along the way. Spend your final evening reflecting on the Balkans’ incredible culture and history.

## Day 10. Transfer to the airport

After breakfast, enjoy your free time before your scheduled transfer to Belgrade’s airport. End of services. Have a safe flight, and cherish the memories of this unforgettable journey!
