

# Serbia & Croatia in one week: From Belgrade to Dubrovnik



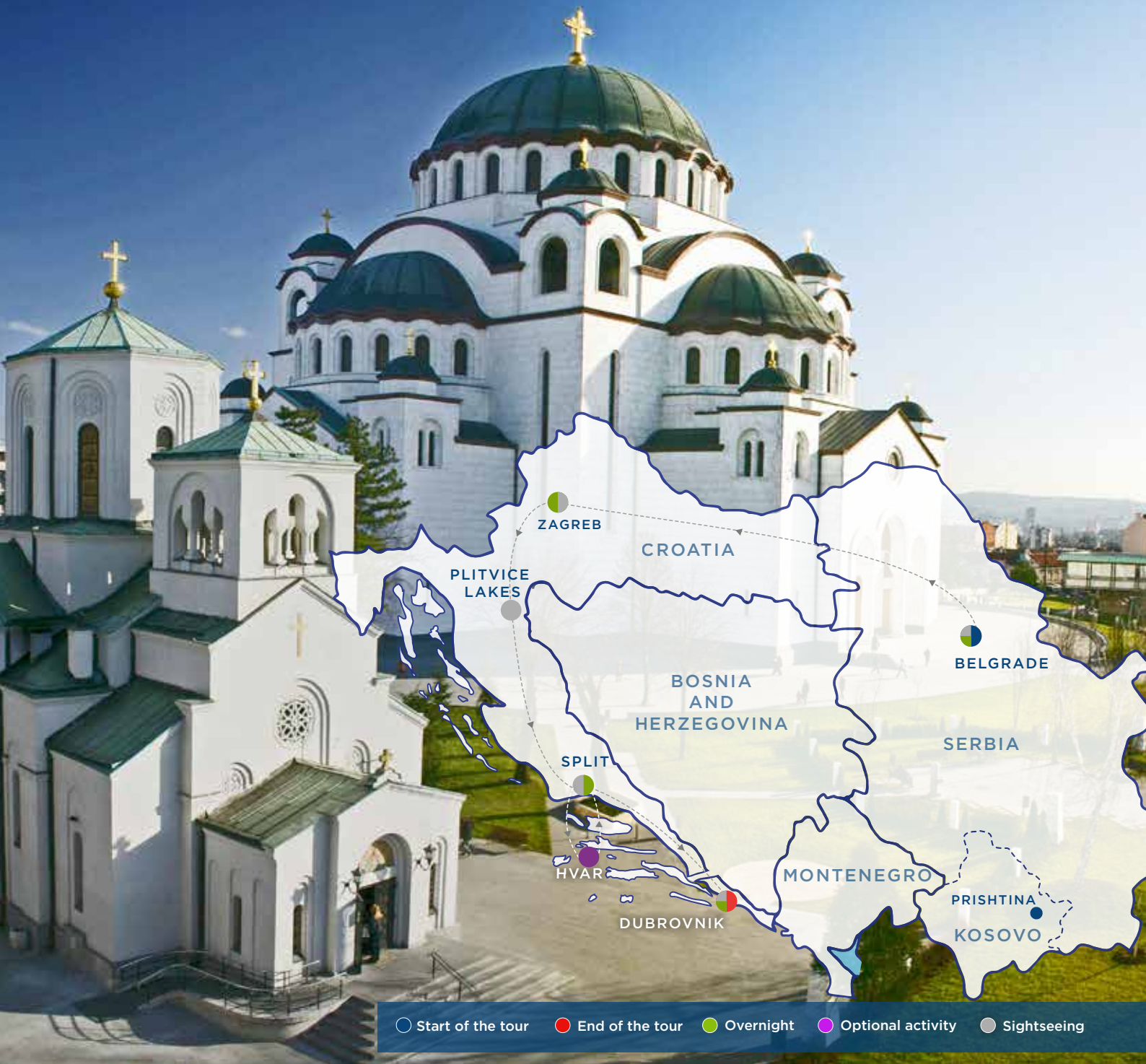

From the bustling streets and vibrant nightlife of Serbia's capital to the stunning Dubrovnik's Historic Old Town, from the picturesque, UNESCO-protected Plitvice Lakes to the idyllic beaches of the Dalmatian coast, you will travel through history, tastes, smells, and views.

## Day 1. Welcome to Serbia

Arrive at “Nikola Tesla” International Airport. Our guide will meet you in the arrivals hall with your name on the signboard. He will help you with your money exchange, give you essential information about Belgrade, help you with your check-in, explain the location of your accommodation, advise you on how to reach the main sights, and give you an overview of current happenings in the city. If your flight is delayed, there is no reason to worry. We will monitor it, and our guide will meet you accordingly. There are no additional charges for flight delays. After a short 20-minute ride, you'll be in the city center. Check in at the hotel, and take the rest of the day to get more familiar with Belgrade. Walk around, or follow your guide's recommendation for dinner.

## Day 2. Explore Belgrade

After breakfast, embark on a sightseeing tour of Belgrade. Visit Belgrade Fortress, including the Victor Monument, Monument of Gratitude to France, and other notable landmarks such as the Zindan Gate and the Clock Tower. Continue with a panoramic ride through New Belgrade, showcasing modern architecture like the Genex Tower, Palace of Federation, and Sava Center. Explore Zemun's charming quarters and fish restaurants along the Danube. Stroll its cobblestone streets and enjoy the blend of Mediterranean and Middle European cultures.

Afterward, drive through Dedinje's luxurious residential area and visit Saint Sava Temple, one of the world's largest Orthodox churches. Spend the afternoon leisurely—visit Nikola Tesla's Museum, wander around central streets, or relax. Explore the Bohemian Quarter of Skadarlija in

the evening for traditional Serbian cuisine and vibrant nightlife.

## Day 3. Transfer to Zagreb & Zagreb walking tour

After breakfast, it's time to move to another beautiful Balkan country—Croatia. We'll head for the Croatian capital, and after roughly 4 hours (depending on the border crossing), we'll reach Zagreb. Check-in at the hotel and take some time to refresh before we start our Zagreb walking tour.

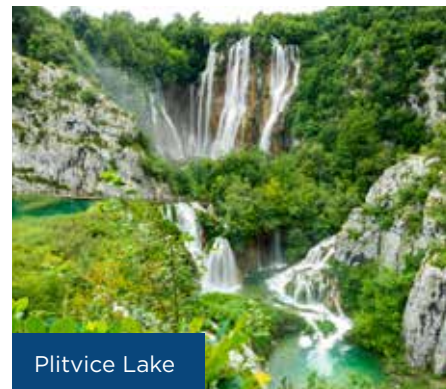
Begin the sightseeing tour in busy Kaptol Square in Upper Town, dominated by the monumental Zagreb Cathedral, with its soaring twin spires, cobblestone streets, and red tile-roofed buildings. Walk along Krvavi Most to St. Mark's Church, with its brightly colored roof, and the 17th-century Jesuit Church of St. Catherine. After a stop at the Parliament building, free time to explore the winding streets of the Old Town and Ban Jelacic, the main square. Or stroll along Ilica Street, packed with restaurants, trendy cafes, and a vibrant shopping scene. Free time to explore on your own.

## Day 4. From Plitvice Lakes to Dalmatian Coast

After breakfast, we'll leave Zagreb behind and drive towards Plitvice Lakes. After around two hours of driving, prepare your cameras since we will arrive at the breathtaking scenery of wonder of nature – Plitvice Lakes National Park, a natural wonder with breathtaking scenery. Enjoy a 3-hour guided tour through a wonderland of 16 interconnecting lakes flanked by thundering waterfalls and a vast primeval forest. This area, known as a geological and hydrological

phenomenon, is celebrated as one of Europe's most beautiful natural sights, inscribed on the **UNESCO** World Heritage list.

We'll have a lunch break, and after approximately two hours of driving, we'll arrive at the **UNESCO**-protected seaside town of Split, the second-largest city in Croatia. Check-in at the hotel. The rest of the day is yours to enjoy a coffee or dinner in one of the numerous restaurants by the sea.

## Day 5. Split – Diocletian's Palace & Game of Thrones

After breakfast, we'll have a walking tour along the Old Town's cobble streets featuring the historic inner city with its dominating Roman influence, built around the 4th-century Palace of Diocletian.

This spectacular palace, a precious example of Roman architecture, is one of the largest and best-preserved in the world. We'll see the remains of the Cathedral of St. Domnius, built in the

Middle Ages, and the Temple of Jupiter with its headless black sphinx guarding the entrance. We'll finish our walking tour around noon, so you'll have plenty of time to design the afternoon. Our suggestion: You high-speed catamaran and check out the famous island of Hvar, book a private Game Of Thrones tour, or walk around beautiful Marjan Hill and check out the museums of Split.

Or finally, you can decide to chill on one of Split's stunning beaches. Whatever you choose, we're sure you'll love this fantastic city.

## Day 6. Dubrovnik, The Pearl of the Adriatic

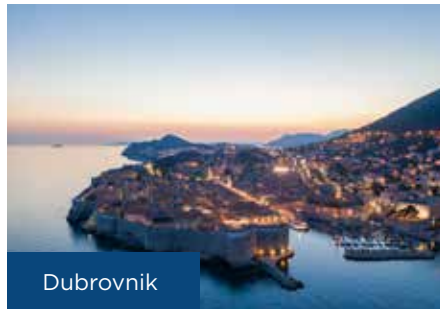
After breakfast, we will proceed to Dubrovnik. After roughly 3 hours of driving along the beautiful Croatian coast and admiring incredible views, we'll arrive at the spectacular walled city of Dubrovnik, lovingly named the "Pearl of the Adriatic." Check-in, a short break, and the "Old Dubrovnik on foot" tour.

The magnificent Old Town was declared a **UNESCO** World Heritage

Site, a treasure of Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque churches, monasteries, and palaces.

The tour highlights sites like Rector's Palace, an outstanding Gothic and Renaissance architecture blend. Also, the monumental Sponza Palace, one of the most beautiful palaces in the city, is preserved in its original form. Under the City Bell Tower on Luza Square, you will see Orlando's Tower, dedicated to the legendary knight who saved the city in the 9th century. After the tour, take some time for yourself. Consider strolling along the impressive ramparts overlooking the shimmering Adriatic Sea or visiting the Maritime Museum in St. John's Castle. You could also check out the parts of Dubrovnik where the famous Game of Thrones was shot, visit Lokrum island and city walls, or ride a Dubrovnik cable car.
